NOTES:

As a requirement for graduation, all students must take six (6) units in one of the National Training Service Program (NSTP) components: Civic Welfare Training Service (CWTS), Literacy Training Service (LTS), and Reserved Officers' Training Corps Military Science (ROTC Mil Sci). These are offered by UPD.

Language Requirement: Students should take 12 units of a European, Asian or Philippine language to be determined by their area of concentration.

CL Concentration Courses (12 units): CL 132, 133, 134, 135. May take CL 198 as long as course topic is related to area of concentration, with consent of program adviser.

CL Elective: Any CL course numbered 100 and above, including courses offered by other CL areas of concentration.

Departmental Elective: Any course numbered 100 and above other than CL.

Free Elective: Any course numbered 100 and above in other disciplines outside of the DECL.

*Selected Topics in the particular area of concentration; is a required course and may also be taken as a concentration course; may be taken twice, as long as course topics are different.

**If a transferee has already taken a Math course in her/his previous course/University, Math 2 need not be prescribed anymore.

***Subject to reconfiguration based on the Revised GE Framework (2016).

The University regularly reviews course curricula and may revise them. Students admitted into this program shall follow the existing curriculum until such time that a new curriculum replacing it has been duly approved for implementation. All courses prescribed and taken under this existing curriculum shall be credited under the new curriculum.

NOTES TO COMPARATIVE LITERATURE ADVISERS

- 1. GE Elective: A student's choice of a GE subject, other than what are indicated/prescribed.
- 2. Eng 11 and Eng 12 must be taken and completed before enrolling in CL 100.
- 3. Prerequisites. CL majors must take and complete, CL 100, CL 30, CL 40, and CL 50 before enlisting in any upper division CL course. The introductory courses CL 30, CL 40, CL 50 may be taken in any order.

Non-CL majors need Eng 11 or Eng 12 or COI to enlist in CL courses numbered 100 and above.

- 4. Language Requirement: Students should take 12 units of a European, Asian or Philippine language to be determined by their area of concentration.

 All 12 units should be in one language.
- 5. CL Concentration Courses (12 units): [Asian Literature] CL 141, CL 142, CL 143, CL 144/145; [European Literature] CL 132, CL 134, CL 134, CL 135; [Philippine Literature] CL 152, 153, 154, 155. May take CL 198 as long as course topic is related to area of concentration, with consent of program adviser.
- 6. VALIDATION FOR ADVANCED CREDITS (Revised UP Code: Art. 359-366; Art. 362 & 363; 2003 Faculty Manual p. 217)

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An admitted transfer student must validate all the courses s/he is offering for advanced credit at the rate of 18 units a semester within a period not exceeding three (3) semesters from the date of his/her admission. Failure to comply with this requirement would mean the cancellation of his/her registration privileges (Revised UP Code: Art. 359-e p.91).

An admitted transfer student may not be allowed to enroll in a subject or subjects the prerequisites of which, taken elsewhere, have not been validated or repeated in the University.

A student transferring from any recognized institution who possesses an Associate in Arts or its equivalent of sixty-six (66) units of work may be enrolled without needing to take validation exams. Before a student is allowed to major in any discipline, the major discipline may prescribe up to 18 units of general education courses and/or preparatory courses for the major, as additional courses. Candidates for a second baccalaureate degree will be required a written comprehensive examination (Revised UP Code: Art. 360 p.91).

7. Graduating students must have their records assessed by the CAL Secretary's Office before enrolment in the first semester of their final year. An application form for graduation must likewise be accomplished.
